

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS - GEAUGA COUNTY, OHIO

FORECLOSURE ACTIONS

- You are being served with a *Summons and Foreclosure Complaint*.
- This action may affect the ownership of your real property.
- To avoid having a judgment by default taken against you, you must e-file with the Clerk of Courts your Answer or Motion for Extension of Time to Answer or Otherwise Plead within twenty-eight (28) days of your receipt of the Summons and Foreclosure Complaint, as specified on the *Summons*.

FORECLOSURE MEDIATION

- Foreclosure Mediation is a free, voluntary and confidential process in which the Mediator, a neutral individual appointed by the Court, assists the parties in meeting, discussing, communication and negotiating to attempt to reach an agreement regarding the dispute which may allow the property owner to remain in the property on terms agreed to by the parties.
- Within twenty-one (21) days of your receipt of the Summons on Complaint, you may request mediation for your case by completing and delivering the forms available at the Clerk of Courts, Geauga County Courthouse, Third Floor, or on their website: <http://www.co.geauga.oh.us/commonpleas/General-Division/Mediation>
 - **E-FILE WITH THE CLERK OF COURTS:** *Request for Mediation*
 - **HAND-DELIVER, MAIL OR E-MAIL:** *Debtor's Questionnaire and Estimated Monthly Income/Expenses Worksheet to: (note that these two documents contain personal information, and should NOT be e-filed)*
